SUBJECT: Bi-Weekly Report of Significant Police Related Incidents

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide you with a brief summary of significant police related incidents and issues occurring between May 18 and June 1, 2016. It also includes highlights of certain planned events occurring over the next two weeks.

Currently in the Town of Huntersville all violent crime is up except aggravated assaults which down by 1 offence when compared to 2015. Gun related crime has shown significant increases when compared to 2015, both in shots fired as well as gun related arrests and incidents. This increase has shown in the increased number of robberies and shots fired calls for service that the HPD has had this year. Overall violent crime is up 30.43% when compared to 2015.

Currently property crime has also shown a major increase when compared to 2015. This increase stems from a major increase in larcenies and auto thefts. Currently shoplifting and larceny from auto are the main driving forces behind the increase in property crime. These two crimes have been on an upward trend in recent months showing increased numbers, with shoplifting being up 12.5% and larceny from autos being up 20.43%. Overall property crime is up 14.41% when compared to 2015.

Currently Part 1 crime overall is up 15.43% when compared to 2015.

Major Incidents

20160527-1128-00 Armed Robbery @ 9815-D Sam Furr Road @ Game Stop

- Two unknown back male suspects enter the business, one is armed with a handgun.
- The suspects demand that the store manager open the safe and give them the money.
- The manager was unable to open the safe and the suspect's fled the business on foot.
- The suspects were not located and did not get any items from the business.
- This cases is currently under investigation by the Criminal Investigative Division



20160521-1234-02 Assault with Deadly Weapon @ 16905 Caldwell Creek Drive

- Female victim advised she was in the parking lot of the business and was trying to turn around to exit due to it being too crowded.
- Victim advised the male driver in the vehicle behind her began cursing and yelling at her.
- Victim advises the male victim pointed a handgun in the air and yelled "what".
- Male subject was placed under arrest. Gun was seized by officers.

20160529-0018-00 Breaking & Entering @ 409 Hunters Road

- An unknown black male suspect was seen forcing entry into an apartment and a witness calls 911.
- The suspect took items from this apartment and was encountered by responding officers outside the residence.
- Patrol officers engaged in foot chase with suspect who jumped from second floor.
- Suspect was apprehended and identified as Christopher Caldwell, a resident of the apartment complex.
- Detectives secured a search warrant and recovered stolen items from out of Caldwell's residence.
- A stolen firearm was recovered from the apartment; suspect is a convicted felon.

- Warrants are currently being processed in relation to this vandalism.












Traffic Collisions Map



In the provided date range 75 vehicle collisions have occurred. The majority of these collision occurred in the Gilead Rd and I-77 area as well as the Sam Fur Rd and I-77 area. Of these collisions only 16 resulted in injury and there were no fatalities.

In comparison to 2015 the Town of Huntersville has seen a slight increase in traffic collisions, up 3.1% YTD. The major cause of these collisions is driver inattention, electronic use, and major traffic on the main roadways.

In the provided data range there were 415 traffic stops. The majority of these traffic stops are occurring in high crash areas such as Gilead Rd and Sam Furr Rd (see map on left)

In comparison to 2015 the Town of Huntersville has seen a decrease in traffic stops by -18%. With increased efforts as well as traffic saturation patrols thus far in 2016 the gap between 2015 and 2016 is beginning to close. This issue is currently being addresses by the patrol lieutenants and the traffic unit.
